



# Fall Could Bring Change to Housing Market

Most are not questioning whether real estate sales in NYC have been slower over the summer months of 2023. But while this reality has brought a bit of pessimism, it has also brought a window of opportunity for those who can look ahead and plan with the market's potential in mind.

To put things into context, a number of factors are lining up that could push real estate in <u>a new direction</u>, and here are some of them:

- Home values are not in decline. Over half of all U.S. metro areas, including NYC, realized <u>price gains</u> in the second quarter of 2023 according to the National Association of Realtors (NAR). More specifically, NYC home values <u>rose 3.4%</u> year over year in June, almost parallelling May's numbers. Low inventory has played a role in these rises, of course, with many Manhattan apartments at different price tiers seeing <u>inventory drops of 25% and up</u> recently.
- Interest rate hikes could slow down or end soon. After 11 federal funds rate hikes brought mortgage interest rates to their highest levels in over 20 years, there's speculation that the Federal Reserve may hold off on a September hike. If inflation continues cooling and unemployment numbers go slightly upward, a November rate hike could be off the table as well. For real estate, it's possible this will trigger mortgage rate

declines and a massive breakout in the market.


- Rental prices are leveling off or lowering. While news headlines are still declaring "all-time highs" across the bureaus, we have personally seen rental prices decrease as summer winds down. In fact, a recent market report found that average rent for a 1-bedroom apartment in Manhattan was \$4,129 in early September, which is 2% less than rent for the same period in 2022. Additionally, we are seeing larger declines at higher price points.
- Summer ended on a sales upswing. The weeks leading up to Labor Day are typically some of the year's slowest for NYC real estate sales. But in the final week of August, 18 contracts were signed for Manhattan luxury real estate, which is one contract ahead of total for that same week in 2022 and above the historic 10-year average for that time period. Another thing to note: A \$92 million condo found a buyer just before Labor Day, making the property at 432 Park Ave the biggest sale of 2023 so far.

As fall approaches, we expect to see many buyers and sellers emerge from the sidelines and view this upcoming season as a time to move into real estate ownership or expansion. We will know soon enough.
